


- The admission Committee counsels the students at the time of admission to help them to select subjects and also about the prospective placement/career opportunities.



6.3.1 Curriculum Development:

As the curriculum is designed by the apex body i.e., University, the Institution has limited role in the preparation and development of curriculum. However, the curriculum for the short term certificate courses is developed by the respective departments of the Institution.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning:

- The faculty attended and presented papers at State/National/International level Conference/Seminar related to teaching techniques and subject up gradation as mentioned below;

- Newly appointed teachers are given training on the use of smart boards.
- In order to improve the quality of teaching and learning process, the institution has purchased 590 text books and 31 reference books; and has also subscribed for e-journals through INFLIBNET.
- Various students centric methods like field visits, film review, study tours, group discussion etc. have been adopted.
- Many students attended and presented papers at national and state/university level conferences, seminars and workshops conducted by other Institutions.

6.3.3 Examination and Evaluation:

- Apart from the two compulsory Internal Assessment tests in each semester as demanded by the affiliating University, various departments also conducted class tests /remedial coaching classes,
- Report writing of Field visits, study tours as well as book and film reviews (in few of the optional subjects) are also used as methods of evaluation.

- Altogether 85 Computers are available in Office, Library, Language Lab & Departments with Internet access & MIS etc.


