6.3 Quality Improvement Strategies Adopted By the Institution for each of the following

6.3.1 Curriculum Development:

As the curriculum is designed by the apex body i.e., University, the Institution has limited role in the preparation and development of curriculum. However the curriculum has been developed for the self-financed certificate courses introduced by the Institution in subjects like English and Mathematics.

6.3.2 Teaching and Learning:

- In order to improve the quality of teaching and learning process, the Institution has purchased 437 text books and 143 reference books; and has also subscribed for e-journals through INFLIBNET
- Various students – centric methods like field visits, film review, study tours, group discussion etc. have been adopted
- Meritorious students have been encouraged to participate in Seminars and Conferences conducted by other Institutions
- Students have been undertaking various projects




